## Arrowmounts Here is one further addition to the line of useful

accessories put out by Arrowtabs Limited. They consist of little pieces of paper 9/16 in. square which are sticky both sides. A long strip of waxed paper of the same width has stuck on to it these little squares, which are peeled off in a moment. To attach a photograph in an album a square is removed from the waxed paper and pressed on to the back of the photograph at one corner, or more (four, if you want to keep the picture quite flat) and then a protective paper on the back of the Arrowmount is removed—revealing a second sticky surface. The print can then be pressed down in the album, where it will be held firmly in place without revealing how. The adhesive is of the kind one finds on the modern transparent tapes, so it requires no licking and the Arrowmounts are just as useful for mounting press cuttings, instruction leaflets and the like which one wants to preserve.
